



"West Indian-born intellectual Edward Wilmot Blyden has been heralded the progenitor of Pan-Africanism, and his 1887 book Christianity, Islam and the Negro Race has been widely acknowledged as pathbreaking by historians of the vast African diaspora. Yet, according to Harry Odamtten in Edward W. Blyden's Intellectual Transformations, much about Blyden's life, work, and contributions to Afropublicanism and Afro-positivism, his key terms for Blyden's overarching philosophy, have been underappreciated and undervalued. Exploring, theorizing, and contextualizing Blyden's travels, influence, and breadth of work, Odamtten boldly and creatively portrays Blyden as one of the most important and influential African public intellectuals of his times. Those who read this intellectual biography will be challenged to rethink Blyden's legacy."



ROFESSOR MAMOKGETHI PHAKENG, the Vice Chancellor of University of Cape Town (UCT), will visit MSU on September 16th and 17th, 2019.

Prof. Phakeng's visit will focus on research collaboration opportunities in Africa and the role of data curation and repositories therein. She will engage MSU leadership on the broader question of a coordination framework for collaborative research between scholars from MSU and UCT.

All are welcome to her broad-audience lecture open to the public, on "Mobilizing data in the Transformation to a Knowledge Society".

Prof. Phakeng was the deputy vice chancellor for research and innovation at the University of South Africa, in Pretoria, for seven years. On January 1st, 2017 she joined UCT as the Deputy Vice Chancellor of Research and Internationalization. She became UCT's Vice Chancellor in July 2018. She was the first black female South African to obtain a PhD in Mathematics Education (2002). UCT is Africa's top-ranked institution of higher education.

Prof. Phakeng will address some of the following points in her lecture:

- The role of MSU and UCT in addressing the Sustainable Development Goals challenging the African continent and the United States
- Openness as a value for science and society
- Social impact through engaged scholarship
- Big data, open data policy and support
- Navigating the legal frameworks for open data
- Fair partnerships in research and innovation
